SUBJECT: Use of Force

I. PURPOSE

To define the policy of the Department of Natural Resources on the Use of Force.

II. POLICY

The department recognizes and respects the value of each human life. In vesting peace officers with the lawful authority to use force to protect the public welfare, a careful balancing of all human interests is required. It is the department policy that when the Use of Force is justified and necessary that the officer shall recognize the totality of the situation and will employ a reasonable degree of force necessary to accomplish a lawful police task. The officer may use any justifiable force available. Each relevant condition relating to the situation will determine the officer's course of action.

Relevant conditions include, but are not limited to the following:

- A. Life Experiences.
- B. Training Experiences.
- C. Job Experiences.
- D. Current or Past Knowledge of the Subject(s).
- E. Equipment Available.
- F. Officer/Subject Factors.
 - 1. Age.
 - 2. Gender.
 - 3. Size.
 - 4. Fitness.
 - 5. Skill Level.
 - 6. Multiple Officers.
 - 7. Multiple Subjects.


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G. Special Considerations.

1. Close Proximity to a Firearm/Weapon.
2. Special Knowledge.
3. Injury or Exhaustion.
4. Ground Position.
5. Disability.
6. Imminent Danger.

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The following diagram represents the department's Situation Based Use of Force Continuum and is offered as a visual representation of available force. The officer shall recognize the totality of the situation and will employ a reasonable degree of force necessary to accomplish a lawful police task. The officer may use any justifiable force available.



III. DEFINITIONS (as used in this policy)

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- A. Force: That degree of influence necessary to safely take a person into custody.
 - 1. Physical Force: Any Use of Force other than officer presence, verbal commands or routine handcuffing of compliant subjects.
 - 2. Non-Deadly Force: Any Use of Force other than that which is considered deadly force.
 - 3. Deadly Force: Any Use of Force that is likely to cause death or serious bodily harm.
- B. Totality of the Situation: All actions and relational factors between parties and conditions surrounding the confrontation.
- C. Probable Cause: Reasonable and articulable facts and circumstances that would cause a reasonable person to believe that a crime has taken place, is taking place or is about to take place.
- D. Reasonable Suspicion/Belief: Officer believes that a given fact or combination of facts exist, and that the circumstances which he knows, or should know, are such as to cause a reasonable person so to believe.
- E. Weapon: Any item which may be used, or designed to be used to threaten, defeat or injure a person.
- F. Displayed: Any action in which a weapon is exhibited in a manner to elicit a desired response of compliance.
- G. Deployed: Any action in which a weapon is utilized in a manner for which it was intended.
- H. Serious Bodily Injury: Bodily injury that creates or causes serious permanent disfigurement, protracted loss or impairment of the function of any bodily member or organ or creates a substantial risk of death.

IV. PROCEDURES

- A. Conditions for use of deadly force (UCA 76-2-404).
 - 1. A peace officer, or any person acting by his command in his aid and assistance, is justified in

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using deadly force when:

- a. the officer is acting in obedience to and in accordance with the judgment of a competent court in executing a penalty of death under Subsection 77-18-5.5 (3) or (4);
 - b. effecting an arrest or preventing an escape from custody following an arrest, where the officer reasonably believes that deadly force is necessary to prevent the arrest from being defeated by escape; and
 - (i) the officer has probable cause to believe that the suspect has committed a felony offense involving the infliction or threatened infliction of death or serious bodily injury or
 - (ii) the officer has probable cause to believe the suspect poses a threat of death or serious bodily injury to the officer or the others if apprehension is delayed; or
 - c. The officer reasonably believes that the use of deadly force is necessary to prevent death or serious bodily injury to the officer or another person.
2. If feasible, a verbal warning should be given by the officer prior to any use of deadly force under subsection (l) (b) or (l) (c).
 3. Department officers shall adhere to the following restrictions:
 - a. Warning shots are prohibited.
 - b. Discharging a firearm at a moving vehicle/vessel or from a moving vehicle/vessel is prohibited unless the involved officer has probable cause to

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believe that the suspect, by his conduct poses significant threat of death or serious bodily injury to the officer or others, and that such Use of Force is believed by the officer to be the only reasonable means by which such suspect's conduct can be terminated.

- c. Firearms shall not be discharged when it appears likely that an innocent person may be injured.
 - d. Officers shall not draw or exhibit their firearm in a law enforcement situation unless circumstances create reasonable belief that it may be necessary to use a weapon.
- B. Conditions for use of non-deadly force and/or physical force.
- 1. Officers are authorized to use department approved non-deadly and/or physical force techniques and shall be issued approved equipment for resolution of incidents, as follows but not limited to:
 - a. Protect themselves or another from physical harm.
 - b. Restrain or subdue a resisting individual.
 - c. Bring situations safely and effectively under control.
- C. Only issued or approved equipment will be carried on duty for the application of physical force, except in emergency situations when it is necessary for officers to use any resource at their disposal.
- D. After physical force is used, an officer shall immediately evaluate the need for medical attention and treatment and arrange for such treatment if that person is injured or complains of injury.
- E. Persons refusing treatment will be transported to a hospital or examined by qualified medical personnel where the refusal will be made a matter of record.

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- F. In the event that an officer uses physical force, that officer shall, as soon as possible, notify their immediate supervisor. If qualified medical personnel substantiate an injury, the supervisor will determine whether they, or their designee, need to respond to the scene.
- G. Reporting and investigating the Use of Force.
1. Anytime a weapon is displayed or deployed, or physical force is used, to protect the officer, another person, or to affect an arrest, the involved officer, or their immediate supervisor if necessary, will submit a Use of Force Notification Form (see Attachment A) as soon as possible and will submit a complete report as soon as practical.
 2. Any discharge of an approved department firearm aside from authorized training, practice, competition, wildlife management, wildlife control or destruction of injured animals, requires Use of Force notification and a written report detailing the circumstances and justification for such action.
 3. A written report will be submitted to the executive director's office outlining the details and circumstances of the incident for the following situations:
 - a. When a Use of Force results in death or serious bodily injury of a person, the protocol investigative team, the department investigative team or the criminal investigative team will conduct the investigation and submit the report. (Refer to the Officer Involved Critical Incident Policy for complete details.)
 - b. When Use of Force results in any injury less than death or serious bodily injury, the involved officer will submit a report of the incident.
- I. Use of physical force investigation.

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1. A supervisor will be immediately notified in incidents as outlined below and will comply with the investigative procedures as required by the department utilizing the Officer Involved Critical Incident Considerations worksheet (see Attachment B).
 - a. When Use of Force results in death or serious bodily injury of a person.
 - b. When a subject complains that an injury has been inflicted and qualified medical personnel substantiate it.
 - c. When a firearm is discharged in any situation outside of training, practice, competition, wildlife management, wildlife control or destruction of an injured animal.

J. Department response.

1. Immediate response and officer welfare.
 - a. Non-Deadly Force Incident.
 - (i) Where a department officer's Use of Force causes serious bodily injury, the officer shall be placed on administrative leave with pay until completing all internal requirements.
 - (ii) The department may provide initial critical incident counseling for the involved officer or the officer may request psychological services.
 - b. Deadly Force Incident.
 - (i) Where a department officer's Use of Force causes death or serious bodily injury, the officer shall be placed on administrative leave with pay until completing all internal requirements.
 - (ii) The department will provide initial critical incident counseling for the involved officer within 72 hours.

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(iii) Prior to reinstatement, an evaluation by a mental health professional will be conducted to determine that the officer is ready to return to duty.

c. Investigation.

The department will evaluate the necessity to initiate the protocol investigative team, if available, and the department investigative team. (Refer to the Officer Involved Critical Incident Policy for complete details).

2. Internal briefing of department law enforcement personnel.

a. With approval of the appropriate division director, the law enforcement chief, or his designee, shall distribute a memorandum to all department law enforcement personnel as soon as possible following the shooting or other officer involved critical incident.

(i) The memorandum shall detail the facts of the incident and assist with minimizing rumors and resolve concerns over unknown circumstances of the incident before rumor and speculation supplants fact.

3. Administrative review of Use of Force incidents.

a. All reported Use of Force incidents will be reviewed by the executive director's office to determine whether:

(i) Department policies or procedures were followed.

(ii) Relevant policy was clearly understandable and effective to cover the situation.

(iii) The department training is currently adequate.

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4. Use of Force Review Board.

- a. A Use of Force Review Board shall be convened whenever a Use of Force involves serious bodily injury or death of a person, whether accidental or intentional. A Use of Force Review Board may be convened to investigate the deployment of a weapon not involving injury to a person, at the discretion of the executive director.
- c. The Use of Force Review Board will conduct informal hearings and discussions involving issues of compliance with appropriate laws, policies and procedures, officer judgment, training and other available information.
- d. The Use of Force Review Board has the authority to call any department employee for testimony, and may request the testimony of any non-department personnel deemed necessary.
- e. The Use of Force Review Board will convene after:
 - (i) the department has completed its investigation, and
 - (ii) the case has been presented to the prosecutor and a complaint is not filed, or
 - (iii) within two weeks of the incident, if the prosecutor or grand jury does not reach a decision the board will review the case. The findings of the board will not be released until final adjudication.
- f. The Use of Force Review Board shall submit a report to the executive director, but shall not make recommendations pertaining to discipline.
- g. The Use of Force Review board shall consist of six (6) members. The board shall be

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appointed by the executive director, and shall consist of:

- (i) Division director or designee,
- (ii) Division law enforcement chief,
- (iii) Regional manager where the incident occurred,
- (iv) Division/region lieutenant or assistant region manager where the incident occurred,
- (v) Appropriate division Use of Force training officer and
- (vi) A peer of the officer involved, selected by the officer.

- h. The department law enforcement director or designee will present the case to the Use of Force Review board.

This directive is for department use only and does not apply in any criminal or civil proceeding. The department policy should not be construed as a creation of higher legal standard of safety or care in an evidentiary sense with respect to third party claims. Violations of this directive will only form the basis of department administrative sanctions.
